

1/3 cup maple syrup

Pinch of salt

4 tbsp white chocolate, melted and cooled

In a food processor or high speed blender add cashews, maple syrup and coconut milk. Process until completely smooth. Add melted chocolate/cacao butter and process until combined. Pour white chocolate mixture into the tart and let set in the refrigerator for about 2-3 hours. Garnish with sugar coated cranberries and white chocolate chips and serve immediately.

Store leftovers in the refrigerator for up to 3 days.

Ingredients: 1 cup cranberries, 1/4 cup maple syrup, 1/4 cup water, 1/4 cup granulated cane sugar In a medium sized pan add water and maple syrup. Heat over medium to high heat until it starts to bubble. Simmer for a couple minutes, then add the cranberries. Simmer for another 5-10 minutes over low heat until almost now liquid remains. It will appear very stick, similar to caramel sugar. Transfer onto a cooling rack and let them sit for about 1-2 minutes. Then place them in a bowl or onto a plate filled with either monk fruit sweetener or granulated sugars. Coat them well and transfer back onto a

cooling rack. Let them dry until maple has hardened and sugar is stuck to the cranberries.

According to the 2023 PIT Count there were 159 people that were experiencing homelessness in Sussex County. 36% of those people were under the age of 18.

All About LIHEAP



The Utility Assistance Team works with the Department of Community Affairs to help create and approve applications for LIHEAP and USF (Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program/Universal Service Fund). Qualifications for these programs are based strictly on household size and monthly income. If approved, clients receive a one-time heating credit, in addition to a monthly credit on natural gas and electric bills.

Family Promise helps spread awareness of these programs through outreach events and community engagement. If qualified, we will work directly with clients to help navigate the online application process. The state also assigns the department with applications throughout Hunterdon, Morris, Sussex, and Warren counties to review and approve for payment.

We understand that rising costs of utility bills can contribute to the financial strain on low-income households. Through administration of the LIHEAP and USF programs, we help our clients sustain their housing and work towards a better future.



Your Sponsorships Matter

With \$500 we are able to provide 40 families with essential toiletry packs.

An essential toiletry pack includes toilet paper, deodorant, shampoo, body wash/soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, and feminine hygiene products.

<u>With \$1000 we are a to provide 5 families of 4 with winter jackets.</u> Winter jackets are imperative to have during the cold winter season.

With \$2500 we are able to provide car repairs.

Car repairs are especially important in Sussex County since it is a rural area and public transportation is nonexistent. Car repairs help clients maintain employment which in turn helps further stabilize their situation.

With S5000 we able to provide shelter to 3 homeless families for one month.

Sussex County does not have any shelters for families that are experiencing homelessness.

Family Promise of Sussex County has three apartments that we put families in until their situation stabilizes. We have a constant waitlist for these shelters.

With \$10,000 we are able to provide a family with one year's worth of <u>case management, financial planning, and financial repair.</u>

Case management allows sustainable change to help foster greater housing stability by removing barriers. Clients learn new life skills, how to budget.

Case management is a client centered approach to support individuals experiencing homelessness. It involves assessing unique needs, coordinating services, and facilitating resources. The primary goal is to help individuals regain stability and self-sufficiency by addressing the underlying issues of their homelessness.
