Family Promise of Sussex County (FPSC) began as a grassroots organization 25 years ago, established by dedicated volunteers who wanted to give back to their community. FPSC Receives Grant for Landlord/Tenant Law Workshops

Stabilizing Tenancy: Eviction Prevention Program (STEPP) began September 10th at Family Promise of Sussex County's Newton Office

The New Jersey State Bar Foundation was founded in 1958 and is responsible for the charitable and educational ventures of the New Jersey State Bar Association. In addition to a grants program, NJSBF offers speakers, educator training, free publications, and programs for school-aged children.

The STEPP Program will provide a series of 10 workshops to educate both landlords and tenants on their rights and responsibilities. Topics will include housing discrimination, leases, rent increases, habitability, eviction, boarding houses and mobile homes, and accessing local resources. There will be another five classes specifically on eviction. The courses will be held at Family Promise of Sussex County's Newton headquarters at 19 Church Street, led by Frank Zywicki, J.D., Program Manager.

In New Jersey, eviction was the second most reported cause of homelessness, per the 2023 Point-in-Time count. Eviction rates in the state have remained high since the eviction moratorium was lifted in January 2022, leaving many people owing more back rent than they can afford. With no constitutionally protected right to counsel in civil cases, and legal aid only able to help a fraction of tenants who receive eviction notices, 98% are left to represent themselves, per an NJ.com article. The STEPP program seeks to educate and empower tenants, while providing useful information to landlords and encouraging more cooperative relationships between the two groups.

The workshop series started on September 10th at 5:30 p.m., and eviction courses will be offered in September, October and November.

From the Hearth Baked Apple Cider Donuts

Prep time: 35 Minutes
Cook time: 10 minutes
Total time: 50 minutes
Yield: 12-14 donuts



For the topping

1 cup (200g)
granulated sugar

3/4 teaspoon
ground cinnamon

3/4 teaspoon
apple pie spice

6 Tablespoons
(85g) unsalted
butter, melted

For the apple cider donuts

1 and 1/2 cups (360ml) apple cider
2 cups (250g) all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon baking soda
3/4 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 teaspoon apple pie spice*
1/4 teaspoon salt
2 Tablespoons (28g) unsalted butter, melted
1 large egg, at room temperature
1/2 cup (100g) packed light or dark brown sugar
1/2 cup (100g) granulated sugar
1/2 cup (120ml) milk, at room temperature
1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract



Instructions

- 1.Reduce the apple cider: Stirring occasionally, simmer the apple cider in a small saucepan over low heat until you're left with about 1/2 cup. Start checking at 10 minutes, 15 minutes, 20 minutes, etc until you have 1/2 cup (120ml). Mine takes about 20 minutes. If there are any spices or solids on top of your reduced apple cider, leave them. Set aside to cool for 10 minutes.
- 2.Preheat oven to 350°F (177°C). Spray donut pan with non-stick spray. Set aside
- 3.Make the donuts: Whisk the flour, baking soda, baking powder, cinnamon, apple pie spice, and salt together in a large bowl. Set aside.
- 4.Whisk the melted butter, egg, brown sugar, granulated sugar, milk, and vanilla extract together. Pour into the dry ingredients, add the reduced apple cider, and whisk everything together until smooth and combined. Batter will be slightly thick.
- 5.Spoon the batter into the donut cavities—for ease, I highly recommend using a large zipped-top bag. Cut a corner off the bottom of the bag and pipe the batter into each donut cup, filling about halfway.
- 6.Bake for 10-11 minutes or until the edges and tops are lightly browned. To test, poke your finger into the top of the donut. If the donut bounces back, they're done. Cool donuts for 2 minutes then transfer to a wire rack. Re-grease the pan and bake the remaining donut batter.
- 7.Coat the donuts: Combine the granulated sugar, cinnamon, and apple pie spice together in a medium bowl. Once cool enough to handle, dunk both sides of each donut in the melted butter, then generously in the apple spice topping.
- 8.Donuts are best served immediately. Leftovers keep well covered tightly at room temperature for up to 2 days or in the refrigerator for up to 5 days.

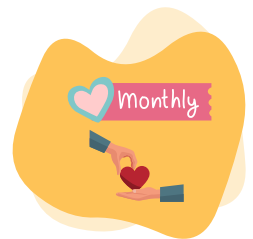
