Homelessness is sharply increasing in Sussex County and statewide. Federal and state funding freezes have jeopardized critical preventive and supportive services. Family Promise of Sussex County has lost government funding for many of our core programs, which serve those experiencing a housing crisis. As a result, we have been forced to lay off over a quarter of our valued employees and have had to limit the essential services we provide to those in need.

Although there are many challenges we are having to navigate, our core mission remains the same - to empower those experiencing a housing crisis to achieve stability and sustainability, because everyone deserves a home.

Appeals for support often include the phrase, "your help is needed now more than ever!" This phrase may seem commonplace, but there has never been a time in our history when we've needed your support more. The needs of the community we serve are visibly increasing. With the ongoing cuts expected to government assistance programs, the need will only continue to grow.


