Jimmy & Rosalynn Carter Work Project - Rural Rally

Habitat for Humanity sponsored its first-ever Jimmy & Rosalynn Carter Work Project Rural Rally during the final week of October — a nationwide effort focused on home builds and rehabilitations in more than 17 rural communities across the United States. This important initiative is helping shine a light on the growing need for affordable housing in rural America. Habitat for Humanity is also expanding its work into Sussex County, bringing additional support to help alleviate housing challenges locally.

Family Promise of Sussex County was proud to attend Day 5 of the Rural Rally as part of the Jimmy & Rosalynn Carter Work Project. The event brought together organizations and community members from all over — advocates, volunteers, and partners united in their commitment to addressing housing insecurity in rural communities.

Our team was grateful for the opportunity to connect with others, share resources, and discuss new ways to expand access to safe and affordable homes. We even rolled up our sleeves and joined volunteers on-site, helping restore a home that had been abandoned for forty years!

Family Promise of Sussex County is excited to continue supporting this momentum and collaborating with Habitat for Humanity and community partners to ensure every individual and family in our region has a place to call home.
